QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Bid Number: SRWWTP 2026-001
Sewer Line Cleaning & CCTV Inspection

1. Will the district be able to provide a Hydrant Meter for cleaning water?

•Water used for jetting will be provided at our WWTP, no potable hydrant water will be provided for cleaning.

2. Will the district be able to provide a disposal site at the WWTP? Does Snake River have a disposal area for the solids, or is the contractor required to locate a disposal site?

•Yes, the WWTP will provide a dumpster for grit/debris disposal.

3. Can you clarify what level of manhole inspection you require – Level 1 or Level 2?

•Level 1

4. The “Scope of Work” document references a sewer line attachment schedule which to be used for pricing. There is no attachment included:

•Apologies for confusion, the “attachment” verbiage should have said “below” to refer to the table on the bottom of the Scope of Work document.

a. There is a list of line sizes and lengths on that document totaling 233,773 LF – Is this the scope we are to price?

b. OR, are we to price the annual 60,000 – 70,000 LF in the overview RFP? If so, what is the LF breakdown?

c. Is there a specific pricing sheet we are to use?

•Proposals should be for the total linear feet to be completed over the four-year period. There is no specific pricing sheet to use.

5. Is pricing for traffic control to be included in the per LF price for each diameter if it is required? Is it a separate bid item or is it cost of actual traffic control invoice plus contractor’s markup?

•Traffic control is only required on CDOT roadways. Reference the area map included on the bid posting for locations. Traffic control costs should be a separate line item on your proposal.

6. For the remaining years of the term if awarded, does the contract allow the opportunity to reprice the remaining scope of the work to account for labor and equipment cost increases?

•No

7. Is there specific scoring criteria for the proposals, i.e., cost = x%, experience = x%, etc.?

•No

8. Will there be a pre-bid meeting for this project?

•No, there is no pre-bid meeting.

9. RFP 5-page document: I see various information points referenced to be included in the proposal. Confirming these items:

a. Proposal Format, potential daily schedule of service

•Please include. Summer hours are 7:00AM – 7:00 PM

b. Part I-Administrative Information, #D/Scheduling: proposal should outline the schedule for commencement of services (is this same as my “a” ?)

•Scheduling in section D of the Request for Proposals references the schedule for the bid process, not the service of the contract.

c. Part I-Administrative Information, #M/Budget – this is the “price per foot” as referenced in the Scope of Work?

•Proposals should include price per foot and any other itemized costs.

d. Part II-Proposal Content: Scope of Work and Qualifications section data requests

•Proposal must clearly address the requirements outlined in the RFP. Any concerns that the contactor may have about meeting these requirements shall be specifically identified in the proposal.

e. Part III-Proposal Evaluation and Selection: Selection Process #3 – submit with proposal a list of subcontractors, etc

•Each Proponent must submit with the proposal a list of all subcontractors, independent contractors or sub-consultants employed or proposed to be employed by the Proponent in the performance of the contract.
